The income from the annual Fair funds our Grants and Scholarship Program. The unit sponsors a Culinary Arts scholarship open to MATC and WCTC students. The fair also provides grants to various entities, including the BBG Herb Garden, Friends of Boerner Children's Educational Program, and several Herb Gardens at Old World Wisconsin.

In March or April, our have our lovely Symposium at the Woman's Club of Wisconsin. Attendees enjoy an herbal continental breakfast, followed by a presentation, and concludes with a marvelous herbal lunch prepared by the chef and staff. Guests may visit the herbal tasting room, shop vendor's tables, and enjoy other fun things.

Monthly we study the HSA Herb of the Month. One meeting is dedicated to the study of the International Herb Association's Herb of the YearTM - its culture, history, lore, culinary, and other uses.
